Application Process Middle School & High School

Application Process

Admissions Criteria

Middle School Eligibility

Entry to the Middle School is based on social, emotional and academic readiness. This includes student performance at or above grade level in all academic areas, satisfactory scores on standardized exams and a record of good conduct.

High School Eligibility

Entry to High School is based on social, emotional and academic readiness for the rigorous college preparatory Mount Madonna High School program. This includes a 3.0 overall average with no grade lower than C, satisfactory scores on standardized exams, and a record of good conduct and positive contributions to the school community. In addition, students are required to have completed at least one year of study of a foreign language, preferably Spanish, prior to enrolling in the 9th grade.

Overview of the Application Process

- 1. Student and parents/guardians visit the school during a Campus Tour Day, Open House or at a time prearranged with the Admissions Office.
- 2. Family receives an application packet by calling the Admissions Office at 408-847-2717, x242. You may also download the application forms from our website at: www.MountMadonnaSchool.org.
- 3. Student spends at least one day a "Shadow Day" at Mount Madonna School.
- 4. Family submits the application & all related documents.
- 5. School reviews the application, including the confidential reports from current teachers. If the application meets basic admission criteria, the student will be invited to interview with faculty members and/or the Director of Admissions.
- 6. The school sends an offer of admission, an invitation to be put in a waitpool for a future opening, or a letter of regret.

Application Deadlines

December 12, 2016 – Early Application Period

The early application period is made available for families with siblings for which they wish to apply for admission. Other families may also apply, if they are certain that Mount Madonna School is the right school for their child (i.e., families have toured the school and feel somewhat familiar with the program offered). Non-refundable enrollment fees for students admitted during this time will be required. Applications will be accepted only for those classes for which there are openings available.

February 27, 2017 – Regular Admissions

We will accept applications for all grades during this time. All application materials, including confidential reports and supporting documents must be submitted by this deadline. Interviews will be scheduled after this date. If applicable, please also submit financial assistance documents by this date.

Notification of acceptance will be mailed by March 17, 2017.

March 24, 2017 - Late Admissions

We will continue to accept and review applications for all grades for which we have openings. All application materials, including confidential reports and supporting documents must be submitted by this deadline. Interviews will be scheduled after this date. If applicable, please also submit financial aid documents by this date. Notification of acceptance will be mailed in April 2017.

Rolling Admissions

Applications received after the March 2017 deadline will be evaluated and admission offered on a space available basis after April 2017. The deadline for submission during rolling admissions is the 20th of each month (i.e., April 20, May 20, June 20, 2016).

Application Process Checklist

☐ Schedule Tour(s) & Student Shadow Day(s)

In order to fully appreciate and see our unique educational programs in action, we ask parents to first visit the campus and meet with a member of our admissions team. Parents/guardians and students view the facilities, learn about the mission and history of our school, the overview of programs, parent participation, transportation and the admissions process. We ask that parents/guardians visit the school in advance of, or at the same time as a student shadow day.

We also require that prospective middle and high school students attend a "Shadow Day" during which the visiting student sits in on classes in his/her current and/or future grade and has the opportunity to meet with faculty and current students.

The Admissions Committee will review all applications upon receipt of the completed Application and Confidential Report Forms. If the applicant meets the admissions criteria, we will contact you to schedule an interview with the prospective student.

Decision Letters and Wait Pools

The Admissions Committee will review all applicant information. You will then receive written notification letting you know the committee's decision. If space is not available at the time you have applied and your student has met the admissions criteria, you may request that your application be kept active and you will be notified when space is available.

- 1) Full payment for the entire school year paid by April 5, 2017 directly to the School (a 1% discount will be applied if payment is received by check or in cash by the due date on the contract); Tuition Refund Plan (see below) at 2.1% of tuition is optional.
- 2) Two-payment option; pay 50% by April 5, 2017 and 50% by August 5, 2017, directly to the school. Tuition Refund Plan (see below) at 2.1% of tuition is optional as long as the final payment is received by the School before classes begin.
- 3) Monthly payments through the FACTS Management Company, generally April 2017 through March 2018. There will be a \$45 charge to set up the contract, payable to FACTS. Tuition Refund Plan (see below) at 2.1% of tuition is required.

Additional Financial Expectations

As is the practice for most independent schools, MMS annually sets tuition at approximately 85-90% of what it actually costs to educate each student for that year. Tuition is intentionally established at this lower rate in order to make a MMS education more financially accessible to a greater number of families.

It is essential that each family help to make up the 10-15% gap between tuition charged and the actual cost through participating in school-endorsed fundraising drives carried out each year.

If you are able to participate in only one school fundraiser this year, please make the Annual Giving your top priority. Contributions are tax-deductible. Tuition can be expected to increase annually by 3% to 6%, depending on operating costs.

Students are enrolled for the entire academic year. In the event that a student withdraws from the School before September 1, 2017, 21% of the annual tuition and the nonrefundable deposit are due. After August 5, 2017 the entire annual tuition is due. See the Tuition Refund Plan for more details.

Tuition Refund Plan Policy

The Tuition Refund Plan is important for Mount Madonna School and its families. MMS requires full payment for the academic year and will make no adjustment of fees for absences, withdrawal or dismissal. Therefore, we are pleased to be able to help protect families' financial investment with the Tuition Refund Plan.

This Plan, offered by A.W.G. Dewar's, provides an allowance of tuition fees in the event of withdrawal of a student, for any reason, or dismissal by the School. The Tuition Refund Plan becomes effective on August 1, 2017 if a student is unable to attend school due to a covered medical reason. The non-medical coverage, which covers voluntary withdrawals and dismissals, becomes effective after the student attends 14 consecutive calendar days beginning with the student's first day in the academic year. The cost is 2.1% of the annual tuition fee for the 2017-18 school year. Parents who do not pay the total annual fees by August 5, 2017 must participate in the Tuition Refund Plan or present evidence of comparable insurance coverage. Participation is optional, but recommended, for those who pay the total annual fees by August 5, 2017. Because we do not give refunds for unused tuition, we recommend all parents participate in this Tuition Refund Plan.

New Family and Sibling Incentive Program

This incentive rewards referrals that result in newly enrolled students who join the school at any point during the school year. A referring family receives a one-time:

- \$1,000 tuition credit for each new family they refer who enrolls one or more students
- \$500 tuition credit for each new sibling within their own family enrolling for the 1st time Credits: When a new student enrolls, the registration paperwork must indicate a referral. All incentive discounts will be credited to the referring family's account 30 days after the new student's start date. The recipient family must have a student enrolled at MMS to receive a credit.

Financial Assistance

Mount Madonna School is committed to maintaining economic diversity within our community of families. The Bernice Arnold Scholarship Endowment and other special donations are allocated for Financial Aid. Financial Aid grants are based on each family's economic needs and must be applied for each year using the NAIS School and Student Service for Financial Aid (www.nais. org). Approximately 25% of the student body receives financial assistance. If you are questioning whether you can afford Mount Madonna School, we encourage you to apply for financial assistance and speak with us about possible ways to make an MMS education affordable for your family. Families will be considered for financial assistance after they have been offered admission to the school – and are encouraged to complete the financial assistance application process by the admission deadline in order to expedite processing of the financial request.

Financial Assistance letters are sent to admitted students in March. If you apply for enrollment and are admitted later than March you can still apply for financial assistance. The Financial Assistance Committee continues to award aid as long as there are funds available. Frequent Questions

1. What makes MMS so different from other schools?

- Questions and Answers For more than 30 years we have made children and education our top priority. This translates into an outstanding program that has evolved and continues to grow.
- Students benefit from small class sizes, low student to teacher ratios, and a staff of exceptionally dedicated, professional educators.
- We are committed to educating the whole child to prepare her/him for a life of meaning and success. The core of the curriculum is academic excellence, creative self-expression and positive character development.
- We offer some unique programs, including an 11th and 12th grade travel program, Values in World Thought; observation of rites of passage at significant ages/grades; field trips, outdoor education and hiking; yoga; children's Life Lab garden; school-wide recycling and composting; inclusive student governance, buddy programs.
- Our Upper Campus is powered by solar energy.

2. Is it too expensive?

No. The school is reasonably priced compared to other private schools, and the benefits far outweigh the costs.

- Mount Madonna School is an important investment: When young people develop a love of learning and genuine self-respect, they can make the most of college, career, and life experiences.
- There are many forms of financial assistance available. Over 1/3 of our families receive some form of tuition assistance.

3. Is the school accredited?

Yes. Mount Madonna School is fully accredited through both of the premier accrediting bodies for independent schools, Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and California Association of Independent Schools (CAIS).

4. Is it too far away?

No, it's worth the commute. Transportation is available, and the location sets Mount Madonna School apart with its exquisite 355 acre mountaintop environment overlooking Monterey Bay.

- Transportation service is available from Gilroy, Morgan Hill, Watsonville, Corralitos, Aptos, Soquel and Santa Cruz.
- Many families carpool.
- The location contributes to a peaceful, natural and safe learning environment.

5. Does the school have a religious affiliation?

No. Mount Madonna School is an independent, non-sectarian school. We believe in embracing all faiths and traditions. Just as we work to support intellectual, emotional, and physical development, we also encourage students to develop their own spiritual awareness. This is part of upholding and educating toward a culture of respect for oneself and others.

Mount Madonna School is hosted by Mount Madonna Center, a community founded on the principles of yoga and dedicated to non-harming, self-development and service to society. The values of the Center and the beauty of the natural environment provide a supportive and inspirational context in which our learning community thrives. Excellence in education is achieved most readily when high academic standards and enthusiasm for learning are both present in the school environment. We are dedicated to nurturing our students' natural curiosity and passion for learning.

6. Where do students go after graduating from MMS?

The majority of our students are accepted to excellent four-year public and private colleges and universities, including the University of California schools, Stanford, Harvard, Princeton, MIT, among others. Some graduates choose to travel or work prior to pursuing higher education and their MMS education prepares them to navigate life's adventures with confidence.

7. What are the expectations for parents at the school?

Parents are considered one of our most important resources in providing an exceptional learning community at Mount Madonna School. We know that when teachers, administrators and parents work together they greatly influence the success of children's education.

- Parents are expected to participate in curricular and extra-curricular activities such as performances, sporting events, field trips and class projects.
- Like most private schools, tuition covers about 85% of the actual cost of education and the additional 15% comes from our fundraising efforts. We count on parents taking an active role to "bridge the gap" between tuition charged and the cost of education at Mount Madonna School.
- Mount Madonna School is strongly committed to the values of respect, community and service. We expect all families to support these values and model them for all of the children.

From Highway 101:

Take Highway 152 west at Gilroy.

Go through Gilroy, remaining on Highway 152, and continue up the mountain approximately 10 miles.

At the top of the mountain, just past the 15 mph curve, turn right into Mount Madonna County Park (Pole Line Road).

Follow the yellow line through the park (2.2 miles). Do not pay the park entrance fee. When you come to the stop sign at the end of the park, continue straight ahead on Summit Road for 1.5 miles (Pole Line Road becomes Summit Road).

Mount Madonna School is on the left at 491 Summit Road.

From Points North on Highway 1:

Take Highway 1 to the Airport Boulevard exit in Watsonville.

Turn left (cross the freeway) at the top of the off-ramp.

Go approximately 3 miles on Airport Boulevard (which will change its name to Holohan Road when it crosses Green Valley), and continue until you reach Highway 152. Turn left (East) onto Highway 152.

Just past the Mount Madonna Inn, at the top of the mountain, turn left into Mount Madonna County Park (Pole Line Road).

Follow the yellow line through the park (2.2 miles). Do not pay the park entrance fee.

When you come to the stop sign at the end of the park, continue straight ahead on Summit Road for 1.5 miles (Pole Line Road becomes Summit Road).

Mount Madonna School is on the left at 491 Summit Road.

From Points South on Highway 1:

In Watsonville, take the Green Valley exit, and turn right on Green Valley.

Take Green Valley east to the intersection with Airport Boulevard (to the left) and Holohan Road (to the right).

Turn right onto Holohan Road and continue to Highway 152. Turn left (East) onto Highway 152. Just past the Mount Madonna Inn, at the top of the mountain, turn left into Mount Madonna County Park (Pole Line Road).

Follow the yellow line through the park. Do not pay the park entrance fee.

When you come to the stop sign at the end of the park, continue straight ahead on Summit Road for 1.5 miles (Pole Line Road becomes Summit Road).
